1) What does a tutoring session look like?

Sessions are one-on-one, - the first part of the hour is working on any homework or test prep the student may have and the remainder of the hour is spent focusing on key areas we see that need more support based on their class placement/grade. Our reading, writing and spelling students are first given a detailed assessment. Their weekly lessons will be based off a comprehension, sequential phonetic checklist. 3) What if we don't have homework or our own materials?


No problem, we will design our own lesson plans around your student's current needs!

4) Can we switch tutors if we feel it is not a good fit?


Absolutely! We understand how intimate a one-on-one teaching environment is and we want to empower your student to connect, ask questions and feel heard by their tutor.

5) Do we have a summer program?


Yes! We love the summer time because we don't have to compete with homework time - we love to target the areas that need the most focus and prepare students for their classes that will start in the Fall.
